President's Message

Happy New Year!

Another year is upon us and I hope you will be able to join us for our first General Meeting of the new year. Our meeting will open with a meet and greet starting at 6:00 pm where you can sign in and look at the beautiful display table filled with blooming orchids brought by our members. If one of your orchids is in bloom, we would love for you to share it with us. Please bring it along and add it to the display table. We all enjoy checking out our fellow members' successes. During this time you can ask questions about the displayed orchids such as ~ What was the environment they grew in? What type of medium was used? What challenges were overcome? The business meeting will begin at 6:30, followed by the Learning Center with Al Sugano at 6:45, a break at 7:15, and our featured speaker beginning at around 7:30.

January is also a good time to do some maintenance on your orchids. I know that I have a lot of re-potting to do. Before I launch myself into that project, I need to make sure I have all the supplies that I will need. Having a clean area or table to use helps keep your orchids from getting infected with pests and gives you room to have everything immediately available at hand. First I use a long handled lighter to clean my tools like pruners and clippers. Then I identify which size of pots I need and sterilize them overnight in a water solution with 10% bleach. Next I will select what type of medium I will be using, if any. Mostly I use orchid bark, but I also have sphagnum grass and rocks available. My re-potting project can be overwhelming, so to keep focused I'll probably set a goal of re-potting a certain number of orchids each day!
