DID YOU KNOW?

Basic Orchid Terminology

Column—This is something that separates the orchid from all other plants. Other plants have two separate reproductive parts called the Anther (male) and Stigma (female). Orchids have a Column where the male and female parts are fused.

Hybrid—offspring of a cross between species or hybrids.

Psuedobulb—thickened portion of the stem of many orchids functioning as a water and food storage device.

Node—joint on a stem or psuedobulb from which a leaf or growth originates.

Medium—material used in a container grown orchid.

Lip—modified petal of the orchid flower specialized to aid in pollination and different than the other petals.

Genus (plural genera) natural grouping of closely related species.

Eye—bud of a sympodial orchid that develops into a new lead.

Sympodial—orchids which grow laterally and produce leafy growths along a rhizome.

CULTURE CORNER

HONO HONO LOVERS

Specie name - Dendrobium *anosmum*. Dormancy usually starts when the night temperature drops—December, January, and February. Due to the rain during these months, the hono-hono can get confused and it may continue to grow. To offset this condition, it is best to cut down the watering to 2 times a week, and trim off the green leaves. Also check for thrips due to the rain. Some time in February your bud should be forming in the stalk. March - increase watering to every day. From March to May you should have flowers in bloom. May-increase watering to twice a day, start fertilizing with water soluble fertilizer once a week. June- you can start planting the new growth that is growing on the stem. June-November is the growing cycle. November - January don't forget to stop fertilizing and less watering.
