Minutes of General Meeting, February 2006

Many members brought beautiful orchids for display in the entrance way.

Wayne Ajimura did a half-hour "Plant Doctor" session from 6:30 - 7:00 PM for a highly appreciative audience, some of whom had brought ailing plants.

Meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM. Bob King was out of town so Wayne Ajimura, V.P. presided over the meeting.

Copies of the Minutes and Treasurer's Report were available for new members and anyone else who had not received the Newsletter.

Anne Notley called for volunteers to work at the Spring Fantasy in March. Sign-up sheets were passed around. Final plans for the



Spring Fantasy were announced.

Al Sugano was the guest speaker. His topic was how to grow Phalaenopsis orchids. He also brought a list of Orchid Names showing the Genus, Abbreviations (which appear on the labels) and Formula for each.

How to Grow Phalaenopsis

Growing this type of orchid is a combination of genetics and environment. They like:

- a temperature range of 73 82 degrees
- no direct sun
- moderate rainfall
- watering every 5 to 7 days
- · air movement around the roots

For example, in Old Koloa Town, the temperatures usually range from 75 - 86 degrees with good humidity levels and plenty of rain with the result that these orchids do well.

Phals have a vegetative cycle and a flowering cycle. The flowering cycle is triggered by reduced daylight and lower temperatures (winter months). You can also 'trick' the plant into flowering by placing ice cubes around the base of the plant for 5 to 6 weeks.

They are prone to root rot caused by over-watering so you need lots of air in the pot. The best pots to use for Phals are azalea pots with 5 parts medium bark and 2 parts large perlite. Do not drench Phals. Mist them 2 to 3 times per week.

Change the bark and re-pot every 1 to 2 years to get rid of decomposed media. Trim off dead roots. Be sure to sterilize cutting tools before working on each plant (TSP, which is available at any hardware store, is recommended). Cut the long roots so they will fit into the pot, reaching the bottom of the pot but not bending. The oldest roots (most likely to be rotted) are at the base of the stem in the center of the plant. Place the trimmed plant into the pot and then loosely add the media.

Clue to repotting: when you see new roots after blooming, check the roots to see if the plant needs to be repotted. Best fertilizer for Phals is 20-20-20.

To get mealie bugs off the Phals, use 8 oz rubbing alcohol and 8 oz of 409 cleaner in a gallon of water. Hand mist and then sponge the leaves gently.

Following the presentation, Al graciously answered many questions from members.

Then we had a plant auction and the door prize plants were distributed, followed by each member in attendance receiving a plant.

Meeting was adjourned at 8:45 PM.
