Orchid Reference Collection Sale

Kenneth Iwai, who loved orchids and was an active member of GIOS, passed away in May of 2017. Over the course of many years, he had built a large collection of orchid related books and reference materials. His family recently donated this collection to GIOS. The orchid books (see sample picture below) include orchid topics such as how to care for, an encyclopedia of, specific types of orchids, picture books, American Orchid Society magazines, and even some books on pests and general gardening.

Because of the size of the collection. the GIOS Board has decided to make all of these wonderful books and magazines available directly to the membership rather than placing them in our library where they may not be as immediately accessible to our interested members.



The collection will be displayed at the next general meeting with a donation jar placed next to it. In exchange for choosing one of these books or magazines, GIOS is requesting a small monetary donation from the member. There are no set prices, but the Board asks members to consider as a minimum donation 25 cents for each magazine and several dollars for the hard bound books. Many of the books are older, but are in good condition. They contain valuable information about the care of orchids that is useful for all of us today, as well as are filled with beautiful pictures.

Fund Raising Ideas

We have many benefits as a member of our club such as keiki plants for each meeting attended, orchid related speakers, monetary show awards, repotting sessions, the Learning Center and the opportunity as volunteers to earn makana points.
