Learning Center: Preparing Orchids For Show

The foundation for preparing your orchids for a Show is re-potting. Re-pot an orchid if:

* It is easy to pull out of the pot

* It has reached the edge of the pot and the roots have overflown the pot rim

* There is no room in the pot for new growth

Elevate and Promote from the Foundation



Put your orchids on a regular watering and fertilizing schedule. "Weekly Weakly" is a good approach. Water your orchids 2-3 times a week and fertilize once a week. You can add a weak fertilizer dissolved in the water or solid time-released fertilizer on the medium. For dissolved fertilizer, 1/4 teaspoon per gallon of 20/20/20, or 1/2 teaspoon per gallon of 10/10/10 fertilizer works well. For time time-released fertilized add a little pinch to each side of the pot as needed.



When watering, water into the pots to fill them and have water running through the pot. Use a spray head that provides a focused volume of flow that is easy to control. It is not necessary to water before fertilizing. For hanging orchids such as Vandas, spray the plants from the leaves down to the roots.

What type of medium should I use? Pine bark is superior to fir bark.

Here's some other helpful suggestions:

Minimizing Blemishes: use a fungicide once or twice a month as needed. Mix 4 teaspoons of baking soda with 2 tablespoons of horticultural oil or neem oil in a gallon of water and spray on plant. A home remedy is one teaspoon of cinnamon in a gallon of water instead of or in addition to.

Dealing with Ants: dissolve 2 tablespoons of sugar and borax in hot water and set out as bait for ants.
