It was good to see everyone at the last meeting. A big mahalo to Mark for sharing his expertise on orchids, especially Vandas. He gave us new facts and also great reminders. I know I immediately thought I'm not fertilizing my orchids enough to keep them healthy and blooming.

Traditionally our June meeting is reserved for a re-potting session. So bring your orchids that you would like to re-pot and if you have some problem ones that you're not sure about, no worries. We have plenty of experienced orchid



enthusiasts to help you. If you don't have any that you want to re-pot, we will have some extras that you can practice on. Expect to put your orchid back in the same pot. If you plan to split into two plants bring an extra pot. Orchids like to be tight, so unless you are splitting, the current pot is perfect. Bring your tools to cut away the dead roots and old parts of the plant. All is always telling us sometimes you have to cut the grandparents off and only keep the healthy parents and kids. The club will provide the bark, sphagnum moss, stakes, twisty ties, and slow release fertilizer.

We are working on obtaining a speaker for our August meeting. We hope to bring an orchid grower from the Big Island. It's always interesting to hear from and talk to growers from around the islands, learn about the type of orchids they grow/sell and what challenges they face.

All About Vandas

Mark Edlund gave a presentation on caring for vandas and answered questions from the group.

There are lots of types and colors of vandas that fall into three broad categories based on leaf shape: terete (round, pencil-like leaves), semi-terete (long narrow leaves), and strap leaf (broad flat leaves).

An easy to care for example of a terete vanda is Miss Joaquim. This is easy to grow, likes full sun, generally blooms in the summer, and needs daily watering because it does not store water. When it grows big, it can be cut in half to propagate it.



This healthy and happy semi-terete example to the left that Mark brought was started a few years ago from a cutting and has grown large enough that it is ready for splitting.

When potting teretes and semi-teretes in containers, Mark uses a charcoal medium rather than bark or moss. For hanging vandas, Mark like putting them in baskets with no medium. They can stay in these baskets for years with no need to re-pot. Hono Hono and similar varieties like growing horizontally

with their sprays draping down.



In response to the many questions, Mark offered the following thoughts:

Vandas in general like full sun, especially the terete and semi-teretes. Vandas grown outdoors in the full sun will tend to have shorter stalks than those grown indoors.

Need to remove a leaf? Split it lengthwise to make removing the two halves easier.

Vandas are heavy feeders and like fertilizer. Fertilize vandas weekly with a evenly balanced fertilizer such as Peters 20/20/20. He prefers a liquid fertilizer to mix with water and spray the plants.

To treat for bugs such as thrips, aphids or mealy bugs, use soap and water to spray and wash the leaves. Spray with Neem oil or orthene, but not in the middle of the day.

Treat fungus with fungicide or hydrogen peroxide to clean and remove rot. Spray or sprinkle alcohol or cinnamon as a preventative.
