President's Message


Aloha,

Getting Judgmental: An Overview of Orchid Judging Dr. James Keach

Our guest speaker was James Keach, the University of Hawai'i extension agent for ornamental and landscape crops, Kaua'i's Master Gardener program coordinator, an Associate Judge with the American Orchid Society, and a member of GIOS. James provided an overview of orchid judging that hopefully helps us better prepare our orchids for the August Show & Sale.

Why judge an orchid at all? For some it is a way to share new and unusual orchids or new hybrids, for others it is an opportunity to show off their growing ability or to appreciate a breeder's success. It also creates a historical record of the wide variety of orchids. For some growers it creates prestige or allows them to ask a higher price for an orchid.

The AOS judging system is based 30% on flower form, 30% on flower color, and 40% on other characteristics. AOS judges write a detailed description of each orchid judged, identifying every part of the flower. AOS offers a variety of awards for both orchids and growers. Some Merit Awards and Cultural Awards are:

First Class Certificate (FCC) awarded to orchids scoring between 90 and 100 points

Award of Merit (AM) awarded to orchids scoring between 80 and 89 points

Highly Commended Certificate (HCC) awarded to orchids scoring between 75 and 79 points

Certificate of Cultural Excellent (CCE) awarded to the exhibitor of a plant of robust health and appearance with an unusually large number of flowers that scores 90 or more points

Certificate of Cultural Merit (CCM) awarded to the exhibitor of a plant of robust health and appearance with an unusually large number of flowers that scores between 80 and 89 points

Show ribbon judging, which is the type of judging GIOS does at its shows, is done by volunteer judges and can offer a broad range of orchid categories for judging and sometimes has its own judging guidelines.

Using examples from the Display Table, Jame's offered these suggestions on how to prepare your orchids for display at a show:

Inspect your plants a month or two in advance looking for new spikes or new buds that might be flowering at show time. Consider the longevity of the flowers as well. How long do they last?

Stake flower spikes early while they are developing to promote tall, upright spikes.



Gussy up your orchid up! Shine the leaves with horticultural oil, remove any water spots from

leaves, add moss or Pele's Hair on top of the medium, set the orchid in a pretty pot (but not visually distracting from the blooms).

Avoid and remove any insects, faded flowers, or damaged areas on leaves.

Fall Orchid Show & Sale

Information for Your Planning

Our GIOS Fall Orchid Show & Sale is scheduled for Friday, August 15, from 3pm to 7pm, and Saturday, August 16, from 9am to 4pm at the Hanapepe United Church of Christ. Set up is Thursday, August 14, from 12pm to 7pm. We hope all of you will consider participating in one or more ways. Here's how!

Bring Blooming Orchids Bring <u>all</u> of your blooming orchids for our display.

Every blooming orchid is beautiful and a welcome addition for the display and to be available for judging. If you have greenery to donate, please bring that as well. This includes Spanish moss (Pele's hair), Song of India and Norfolk pine boughs. Here is what you need to do:

Email the name of all of your blooming orchids along with your name to Joyce Edlund at <u>joyce.krasz@gmail.com</u> by Monday, August 11 at 10pm. Joyce will make name tags for all of your orchids.

Drop off your orchids at the church between 2pm and 7pm on Thursday, August 14, or make arrangements for someone else to drop off your orchids.

Pick up your orchids at the church between 4pm and 5:30pm on Saturday, August 16, or make other arrangements for someone else to take your orchids from the church.

Donate Baked Goods Our bake sale is always a big hit with people visiting our show. Drop off any delicious baked goods at the church between 2pm and 6pm on Thursday, August 14, or Friday, August 15 after 1pm. Contact Caryn Sakahashi at caryns1@hotmail.com to make other arrangements.

Volunteer To Help As always, we need volunteers to make our show a success. There are many volunteer opportunities, see the following descriptions. Sign ups will be at the August 8 General Meeting, or email Paula Alquiza at pastalqz@gmail.com to volunteer if you cannot attend the General Meeting. To make sure all members have a chance to sign up, we will have a first round where members can only sign up for one shift. After everyone has had a chance, we will re-open sign-ups for members to fill in the remaining shifts. Experienced members will be at the sign-up tables to assist with any questions members may have.

<u>Front Door Greeter</u> - Greet visitors on the lanai prior to them entering the display area. Describe how the show is set up and what the different areas are: Demonstration Area, Membership table, Lucky Baskets, Orchid Cultural table, Display Area, Baked



Goods Area, and Sales Area where the orchid vendors are located and the club orchid supplies are sold.



<u>Membership/Lucky Baskets/Donations</u> - Welcome visitors at the entrance as they enter the display area. Membership brochures will be on display. Discuss the benefits of being a member such as expert speakers, the re-potting sessions, a free orchid at each meeting, volunteer rewards and other special events. Take entries for the lucky drawing, accept

<u>Baked Goods Sales</u> - Manage the baked goods area making sure all donated items are wrapped and priced. Monitor baked goods during the shift and restock as needed. Appointed Baked Goods cashier receives money for sales of baked goods.

donations, and receive forms and dues for new memberships.



Fall Orchid Show & Sale Information for Your Planning continued

<u>Security</u> - Oversee the plant display area and remain in the display area during assigned shift. Patrol area and notify visitors not to touch or move plants. Answer any questions about plants or other areas of interest.



<u>General Floater</u> - Walk though all areas of the show. Identify and help any people that need assistance. Be prepared and able to fill in any volunteer role as needed.



<u>Orchid Supply Sales</u> - Actively sell supply and craft items that the club offers. Upon arriving at the show, make yourself aware of all the items for sale and the posted price. Answer questions from attendees and make note of any items that are asked about for future shows. Appointed Orchid Supply cashier receives money for sales.

<u>Cashiers</u> - Cashiers in all categories: supplies, food, membership will receive a cash bag/box with an accounting form and an initial bank of funds. A standard form is used for counting and categorizing money received. Upon arrival, the first shift cashier should count the money to validate what the form indicates. Any discrepancy should be discussed with Treasurer. The cashier will count the money again at the end of the day and turn it in to the Treasurer, who will count the money upon receipt of cash bag/box. We do take credit cards. Be aware of who to reach out to for all credit card sales.





<u>Truck Drivers & Helpers</u> - Meet at GIOS shed at 12pm on Thursday, August 14 with your truck, the location in Hanapepe will be provided. Retrieve items identified by the Show Chair from the shed and bring them to the church. Unload the truck and separate items that need to be built prior to set up volunteers arrival. These include the lattice, trellis, bench and hanging stands.

<u>Set Up Team</u> - Volunteers will arrive on a staggered timeline. Set up volunteers will arrive at the church at either 12:30pm or 2:00pm. Early shift helps unload trucks and begins building display materials. Full descriptions of set-up tasks will be provided on site.





<u>Tear Down Team</u> - Volunteers arrive ready to start dismantling the display and vendor area upon closing of show at 4pm on Saturday. This includes removing display orchids, removing greenery from the display, and more. Full descriptions of tear down tasks will be provided on site.

All volunteers please check in prior to your shift with the Baked Goods cashier in the kitchen. A complete list of volunteers by day and shift will be in the kitchen area. Ask for assistance from any Board member or Show Chair if you have any difficulty checking in. All members volunteering for the different areas should be available to answer questions from attendees and direct them to areas such as Membership for detailed information.
